The Position

The Adventure Park Maintenance Worker will operate under the supervision of the Sq'ewá:lxw First Nation Maintenance Coordinator to maintain the trail network and ensure that guests to the Adventure Park enjoy a safe, clean, and welcoming environment.

Essential Duties, Responsibilities & Job Requirements:

- A passion for the outdoors and a commitment to maintaining high-quality trail networks
- Prepared to learn and enhance skills required for sustainable trail design, construction and maintenance and apply these principles in the field
- Ability to work productively doing labor intense work in an outdoor work environment under variable weather conditions
- Capable of following a maintenance work plan performing tasks according to a set schedule set by the Maintenance Coordinator
- Capable of working both as team member or independently in an outdoor environment
- Mature, honest, dependable and timely
- Ability to adapt to unpredictable work situations
- Strong communication skills and ability to understand and follow instruction
- Ability to read and interpret maps, specifications and plans
- Capable of providing weekly written and/or verbal completed tasks
- Experience with use of Personal Protective Equipment
- Ability to maintain a safe and enjoyable work environment
- Experience in safely operating a variety of landscaping tools and equipment
- Valid driver's license and access to a reliable vehicle

Personal Protective Equipment

Personal Protective Equipment that will be supplied to the Adventure Park Maintenance Worker by the employer will include the following:

- Hard hat with face shield and ear plugs
- Eye Protection (i.e. Safety Glasses, Sunglasses)

- Protective Footwear (i.e. Steel Toed Work Boots)
- Protective Work Gloves
- Covid-19 applicable equipment and supplies.

The Employee is responsible for provision of the following personal work equipment:

- Protective Outerwear (i.e. work pants, shirts, jackets)
- Knee Pads
- Sunscreen and Bug Repellent
- Operational cell phone for emergency use and communications for coordination of work.
- Backpack or other appropriate means to carry gear and supplies into the field

Transportation

- The Nation will not provide and/or arrange for transportation to and from the work site

Additional Notes

- This position is 32 hours per week with an hourly rate of \$20.00. Timesheets will be required to be submitted to the Office Manager bi-weekly
- This position is temporary and will begin **May 17, 2021 and end August 20, 2021**
- This is a Summer Student Position – eligibility is for post-secondary students (those beginning or returning to post-secondary education in the fall)
- The applicant must self identify as Indigenous or Metis.
